The Modern and Medieval Languages written assessment will be invigilated via Zoom. We will send you a link to access the session along with detailed instructions shortly before the test date. You may take the assessment at your home or school – whichever environment feels the most comfortable to you and has the most reliable internet connection.

The invigilator will allow **60 Minutes** for the completion of the paper, and you must stop writing when instructed. If you have been granted extra time to complete the assessment, then please refer to the timing provided to you by the College assessing your application. You will be asked to stay on the call until the receipt of your completed answer has been confirmed.

Please read the passages provided carefully and then answer the questions following it.

Your response to Section A **MUST** be in ONE of the languages that you are applying to study here. If you are studying at A-level (A2) or equivalent both of the languages you wish to study here, you are free to write in either language. Please write APPROXIMATELY 250 WORDS in your answer.

Your response to Section B **MUST** be in English. Please note that you will not be penalised if you don't know the correct terminology to describe the use of English in the passage.

If possible, please write your answers **by hand**. Your invigilator will provide instructions about how to return it. Please provide your answers as a PDF and **save using the file name: UCAS number_College_Surname_First Name**

Your work must be entirely your own, unaided by consultation with any other person. Answers will be checked for academic integrity, including plagiarism and the undeclared use of artificial intelligence or machine translation (e.g. Google Translate); this will include where passages have been produced by AI and manually rewritten. Breaches of academic integrity are taken seriously and will invalidate your application. Use of reference works (e.g. dictionaries) or other resources is **not** permitted, and the invigilator will report if you are suspected of using these, or receiving other help, during the assessment.

If you experience any difficulty during the assessment, either technical or personal, you should report this to the invigilator as soon as possible for taking into proper consideration.
